

# How to draw a windy day

1. Take a blank piece of paper
2. That's it. You've finished.  
Put your feet up and relax.  
The end

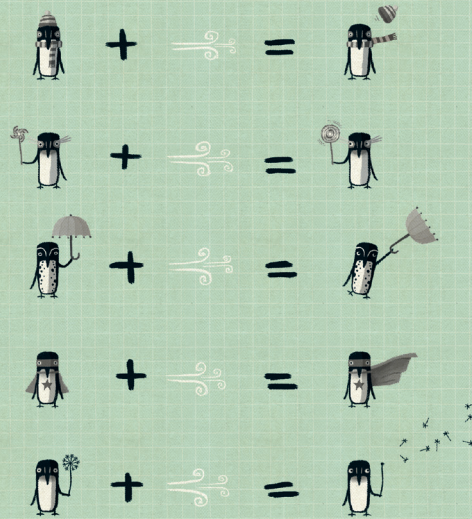


Oh. Apparently this  
isn't good enough...



Ok. So if we can't draw the wind itself why don't we try and draw the EFFECT that the wind has on the things that it blows

( see complicated maths equations for examples )



First, let's choose a subject.  
How about a monkey?  
Everybody loves monkeys



1. Draw a dark grey, round-ended oblong with two holes in it



2. Add a dark grey, curved blob to the bottom



3. Draw a squiggly, curly line like this (it's the monkey's nose)



4. Add a little blue line for his mouth. It's up to you whether you make him happy or sad



5. Now for the eyes. They are blue on the outside and orange on the inside



6. Draw lots of spiky, pale grey fur around his face



7. Add the top of his head. Cover it with lots of little lines in dark grey for the fur



8. Stick two lovely big ears onto each side of his head



9. Now add a long, grey blob underneath the head. This will be his body



10. Again, cover in little lines and draw a dark grey circle for his belly. Don't forget his belly button



11. Give him legs and feet. Remember, monkeys have thumbs on their feet as well as their hands



12. Now add a nice, curly tail (this is my favourite bit)

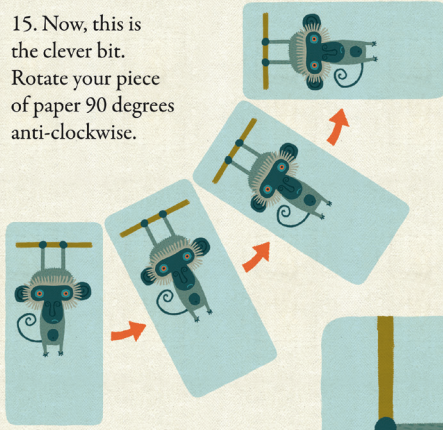


13. Draw two lines with circles on the end coming straight out of the top of his head

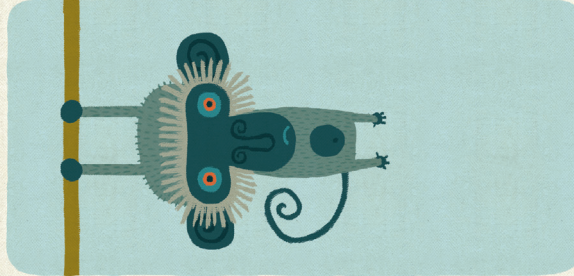


14. Add a horizontal line going between the circles and continuing out on each side

15. Now, this is the clever bit. Rotate your piece of paper 90 degrees anti-clockwise.



16. Look! Suddenly your monkey is clinging to a tree trunk to keep from being blown away by the wind!



He doesn't have to be holding on to a palm tree like this. It could be a windy day anywhere.



Maybe on top of a castle...



...or even at the South Pole.
